ST. THOMAS – THE APOSTLE OF INDIA

Feast Day – July 3rd



Most of us have heard the phrase "Doubting Thomas" and have perhaps used it in figurative speech. It refers to someone who doesn't believe something unless they see proof. This saying comes from St. Thomas, one of the twelve apostles of Jesus. He attained this title for his refusal to believe the Resurrection of Jesus until he saw and touched Jesus himself.

When Jesus appeared to the apostles after His resurrection, Thomas wasn't there. Later, Jesus came again and invited Thomas to touch His wounds. Only then did Thomas truly believe and said, "My Lord and my God."

St. Thomas was a simple fisherman from Galilee. He was called by Jesus to be one of His 12 Apostles. Even though he is known for doubting, he actually loved Jesus very much, and this can be seen in the Bible. We can see that he was brave and ready to go with Jesus, even when it was dangerous.

After Jesus' ascension, the apostles went to different places to spread His message. St. Thomas came to India in 52 A.D. He first arrived in Kerala, at a place called Muziris (now Kodungallar). He preached about Jesus and started some of the first Christian communities in India. It is said that he built seven and a half churches and converted many people.

Later, St. Thomas went to Tamil Nadu, where he continued his mission. Sadly, he was killed there in 72 A.D. in a place called Mylapore, which is now part of Chennai. Today, the Santhome Basilica (Chennai, Tamil Nadu) stands over the place where he is believed to be buried.

St. Thomas is remembered as the Apostle of India, and many Christians in India, especially in Kerala, look up to him as the one who brought the Christian faith to their land. Thomas the Apostle founded the Syro- Malabar Church in southern India, in the present state of Kerala. At the time, the people referred to themselves as St.

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
Thomas Christians. The Syro-Malabar and Syro-Malankara Churches are considered part of the legacy he left behind. These churches still follow the traditions believed to have started with him.

The story of St. Thomas reminds us that it's okay to have doubts, as long as we keep searching for the truth. In the end, St. Thomas went from doubting to believing deeply, and he gave his life for what he believed.



We feel the need for funds that will be spent on welfare activities such as, fellowship celebrating birthdays, festivals and days of National and International importance. We impart education specially to read and write. We have opportunity to teach music and drawing and painting and of course, we extend help in providing security deposits for inmates going on Parole/Furlough. Prison Ministry comes to their aid. We have Rehabilitation homes for released prisoners and we also have Kolbe Homes for housing the children of convicts. The children are sent to schools.

It is a benevolent gesture of our donors/ well-wishers that make it possible for PMI to carry on with the welfare activities. We also invite parishes to perform programs for the inmates. Recently, three Parishes celebrated Easter. It was a grand success. The inmates enjoyed every moment. It is our earnest desire to be with the inmates to give them the hope which they require.

Prison Ministry India Goa, pray for our benefactors who mean so much to us as they make it possible for us to have welfare activities for the least, last and the lost. God Bless them.


- ·Fr. Informed that catechism classes will commence from 8th June 2025.
